CURRENT SPEEDS ARE UNSTABLE

The instability of the current broadband infrastructure and the impact it has on work, business, youth, daily life and development in rural areas is cause for concern



BROADBAND CONTENTION **RATE**

Wireless Broadband exist already and could be extended quickly relative to fibre/wire installations, but only a limited number of users can be active on wireless broadband before users experience speed decreases for all. This is often called the **contention rate**. However, can wireless still have an interim role to play in broadband?



Mini-micro hubs in places such as Community Halls, Parish Halls, GAA clubs etc to allow for people and business to have availability of super-fast broadband in their local areas

> Local Authorities have been asked to nominate areas and buildings to act as the hubs.

Possible interim solution brokered by KLP with the possible introduction of wireless broadband in the short-to-medium term

Local Authorities to set up a "Digital Strategy" for each county with Kilkenny County Council in the process of setting up a digital strategy group for the County



Coordination between LEADER. Local Authorities and the Department of Communication, Climate Action and Environment (DCCAE) on identifying locations that will be the last to get the fibre rollout and potential solutions for these areas.

Due to the need for a minimum number of subscribers to access networks, the idea for the potential bundling of packages by LEADER or/and Local Authorities to increase purchasing power with retail operators was raised.
